Hull Park

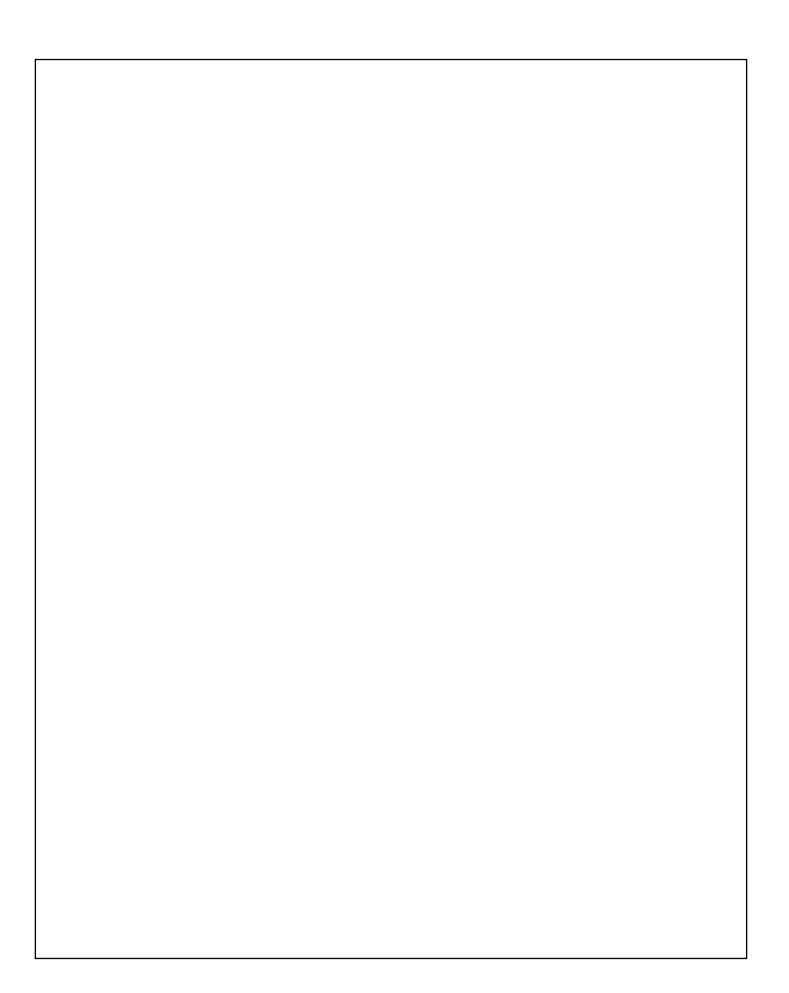

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
SUBJECT: Art on the TART


As you may recall, at your November 2019 meeting, the Arts Commission allocated \$10,000 from the Public Art Trust Fund to install several art pieces at strategic locations along the Boardman Loop Trail - part of TART's "Art on the TART" program. The remainder of the costs for the associated landscaping are to be incurred by TART.

The first location is slated for the 10th Street Trailhead, just behind Oryana. Although the art piece has not yet been selected, TART (and Oryana) is eager to embark on some significant landscaping improvements.

In July, the City Commission approved the issuance of a service order to INHABITECT to manage the installation of landscaping at the 10th Street Trailhead. TART is working with INHABITECT to manage the design and installation of the landscaping, for an estimated cost of \$14,985.00. Again, these costs are to be incurred by TART. A preliminary site plan and INHABITECT's proposal is attached. However, TART and INHABITECT continue to refine the site plan.

The Arts Commission will need to initiate a process to determine the art installation for the 10th Street Trailhead.

Caitlin -

This proposal is in response to your request to provide a proposal to manage the design, detailing and installation of the $10^{\rm th}$ Street Trailhead located at Oryana in Traverse City, MI. Inhabitect is capable of designing and building this entire project and hope this is agreeable to the TART Trail organization and other team members.

Design and Planning:

The first step of this process would be to refine the concept for this space that was provided by another professional. She has done a great job of showing the desired look for the space. This would greatly reduce the hours required to get this project fully drawn and detailed.

If Inhabitect were ultimately hired for this project we would provide a set of scaled drawings. This will outline our plant selections as well as detail how things will be put together, planted, etc.

Below are the maximum hours required to put this plan together. We will not exceed this amount unless approved in writing by the client.

Junior Designer/Drafter: 30 hrs @ \$65.00/hour

Senior Designer: 8 hrs @ \$95.00/hour Administrative: 5 hrs @ \$50.00/hour

Maximum cost: \$2,985.00

Installation Budget:

Below is a rough preliminary budget for the installation of the conceptual plan that was provided. This pricing will need to be refined once the design is finalized and the client makes exactly material choices.

This includes the following scopes of work (this may change based on design):

- Site Prep/Grubbing
- Landscape plantings (Large trees and perennials)
- Stone Mulch and aluminum edging
- Bench construction and placement
- Mobilization, Machine time and Misc tools
